### EXHIBITS COMING SOON

**OCTOBER** ~ A new exhibit will be coming to the Museum gallery wall from October 1<sup>st</sup> through October 26<sup>th</sup>. From the museum archives the Map Collection of George West will make its debut for visitors to the museum. The collection includes small maps printed by West in his newspapers and books, hand drawn maps, local plats and maps by grandson Philip West, and George's own vintage classroom-style 1899 United States map featuring Indian, Military, and forest reservations, and Railroads and canals.

**NOVEMBER** ~ The November exhibit "INK" will begin on Tuesday, October 29<sup>th</sup> and run through Wednesday, November 27<sup>th</sup>. The exhibit will highlight some milestones in the development and use of ink and printing over the centuries.

**DECEMBER** ~ On Saturday, November 30<sup>th</sup> Holiday Junction, the miniature HO Scale model railroad replica of 1920 St. Andrews returns! Bring family and holiday guests to see this special museum creation that only comes out in December and January each year.

The December gallery wall exhibit will be "George & Hawk, An Extraordinary Friendship". The strong, individual identities of two remarkable St. Andrews Bay area pioneers harmonized with each other and blended into an extraordinary friendship. The friendship of George West and Narcisco "Hawk" Massalina was documented in West's diaries and in his photography. Because of West's photography, we have photos of Hawk Massalina from the late 1800's. George would travel to St. Andrews Bay each winter where he fished, hunted, and traveled St. Andrews Bay alongside Hawk. When he returned north, George would develop his photographs and he mailed some to Hawk. The 9-panel exhibit, includes photos, diary excerpts, notes, and newspaper stories.

#### ST. ANDREWS HISTORIC SIGNAGE

The history of the house at 1615 Drummond Avenue has been researched and what a remarkable tale! It will be added to the St. Andrews Historic Trail map in the next printing.

Now named "The Painted Lady", c. 1886, this property was purchased by Sarah R. Russell during the land boom of 1886. The house was built of heart pine from the saw mill just west of here at Danford Avenue. In 1899 Lewis Earl and Dollie Danford bought the house. Danford and Harbor Pilot, Melvin Beck, operated a general store in this West End neighborhood of St. Andrews. Danford was working as First Mate on the *S. S. Tarpon* when it sank on September 1, 1937 and was 1 of 18 survivors of the 31 people onboard. He deeded the house to Beck in 1925, possibly as part of settlement when the pair ended their partnership in business.

Other families resided here until 2022 when it was purchased and extensively restored and renovated. New pine flooring from a mill in Freeport, Florida and vintage stained glass from an old church were installed. Some of the original heart pine walls remain in the house.
